Consider these alarming statistics:

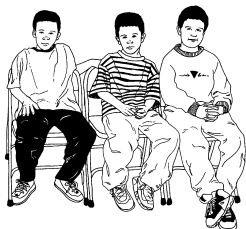
*2/3 of children who regularly attend church will leave the church after teen years and never return.
